Awards:

The individual member recognition program offers a series of six unique award pins recognizing members who sponsor three, 10, 25, 50, 75 and 100 members. All are 10 karat gold-filled with a distinctive wreath design. The precious stones set in the 10 to 100 member pins symbolize the value for the sponsoring member's achievement:

- 10 —three blue sapphires;
- 25 —three emeralds;
- 50 —a diamond and two sapphires;
- 75 —2 diamonds and a sapphire;
- 100—3 full-cut diamonds.
