## Killeen Area Heritage Association

The Killeen Area Heritage Association began in 1983. Dick Thomas twisted Annette Lucksinger's arm and said he thought we should have a historic agency in this area. The chapter was officially established in 1984. They originally confined their efforts to brochures and historical sites. In 1991 they took over the Bethel Primitive Baptist Church because its membership had dwindled to six. The church is the oldest building in Killeen thought to have been built in 1864. It was originally built in Palo Alto in but brought in from there in 1889 and put there, right on Nolan Creek to help facilitate baptisms. After they were given the building they started to get money from the City of Killeen Hotel/Motel Occupancy tax fund. They established their credibility and used the city's grant for preservation and safety upgrades.

Their members give special tours of the historical sites in the city and have several displays in city buildings (i.e. city hall and the municipal courts building).
