ONE NATION UNDER GOD PRAYER BREAKFAST

We held our annual One Nation Under God Prayer Breakfast with Dr. Ann Farris (former Youth of the Year 1967) as our guest speaker. Dr. Farris is a professor at Tarleton State University - Central Texas who uses imagery to get her message across. She brought in a patch work quilt and explained that individually each piece is small and can not do much, but when it is sewn into a quilt it becomes much more than itself. The thread used to bind it is our faith in our country, made ever strong by the belief in God and country. There was a "passive" collection at the end of the program with \$160 going to the local Food Care Center where Dr. Farris is the co-director. According to a recent publication from the Austin Food Bank, every \$1 donated equals five meals, a gift of \$27 could feed 135 people.
