In addition, clubs can support efforts to improve and expand fire fighting units in their community or install smoke alarms in the homes of needy families

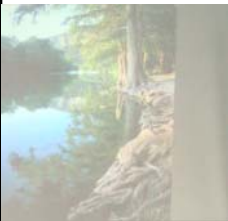
